Our clinic provides low cost spay/neuter to the public for owned pets. We offer vaccinations for an additional charge when the pet is being sterilized. Please visit us online for a complete list of options and prices.

Last year more than 18,000 dogs and cats were euthanized in Hillsborough County. Please make sure your pets are sterilized.

Hillsborough County has a voucher program for low-income residents to get their pets fixed for a co-pay of \$10. It includes a spay/neuter surgery, registration tag and rabies vaccine. Contact Hillsborough County Animal Services at (813) 744-5660 to apply for a voucher

REASONS TO SPAY/NEUTER YOUR PET

- Avoids unwanted litters (18,000 dogs & cats were euthanized in Hillsborough County last year)
- No annoying advances or serenades from neighborhood males
- Reduces susceptibility to mammary cancer and uterine infections
- Discourages "wandering" which all too often leads to fights, car accidents and the spread of disease
- No foul smelling sprays as your pet stakes out his territory in and around your home
- Reduces tendencies toward overly aggressive behavior
- Reduces the likelihood of his developing prostate infections and cancer
- Increases tendency to be more gentle and affectionate
- Increases the chance of adoption for already homeless animals by reducing the population
- Contrary to popular thought, neutered pets are not inclined to be inactive or overweight

OTHER SERVICES PROVIDED BY HSTB

Pet Adoption

All pets adopted from the Humane Society of Tampa Bay are spayed or neutered, have up-to-date shots, and are implanted with a microchip for identification.

Food Assistance

In these difficult financial times, the Humane Society of Tampa Bay is giving free pet food to anyone in need at the shelter.

Community Outreach

HSTB strives to make our community more aware of the needs of animals, the responsibilities of pet ownership, and the problems surrounding animal welfare by visiting schools, giving lectures at community events, and conducting tours of our facility to public groups.

Animeals

HSTB volunteers deliver free pet food once a month to homebound and elderly residents of Hillsborough County on fixed incomes who would otherwise be unable to keep their animal companions.

Humane Euthanasia

HSTB provides euthanasia for owned pets who are sick or elderly to relieve suffering. This service is available Tues/Wed 11am to 5pm or Thurs/Fri/Sat. 10am to 3pm. HSTB also offers private cremation services for pets. Prices vary by weight.
